Attorney Wendy Lee discusses the Executive Order on AI. Lee's expertise stems from her extensive experience in technology and legal advisory roles, particularly in AI and fintech. The EO emphasizes fairness and accountability, urging collaboration between government and companies. However, it doesn't alter existing liability laws. Worker protections in light of AI advancements are evolving, with the Department of Labor offering guidance. While the EO aims for international cooperation, it doesn't guarantee global consensus on AI regulation. Balancing regulation with innovation remains a challenge, with legal and compliance collaboration crucial for tech developers. Explainability of AI poses significant legal challenges, despite efforts by bodies like NIST. Privacy protection in the US lacks federal legislation, relying on state laws amidst global precedents set by countries like Europe and China.
